Electronic Voting Systems Security Policy - 2023

According to WV Code §3-4A-1(b), the security policy for electronic voting systems is as follows:

1.) The equipment is secured from tampering by the following practices:

We have installed "Level-2", high security padlocks, locks and deadbolts on all of the doors. We're contracted with Cox Security Services who are franchised with ADT Security Monitoring Services. We have installed door contacts, glass-break detectors, motion detectors, a programmable keypad, internet accessible video surveillance /recording system, an exterior siren and a battery backup. The facility is climate controlled.

2.) The circumstances under which county personnel are authorized to have access to the electronic voting equipment is as follows:

Access to the voting equipment can be made by the County Clerk or by one to two Election Machine Technicians. There are also occasions in which county maintenance personnel are allowed limited access for routine building inspections and maintenance upgrades. These projects are scrutinized and supervised by Election Personnel. They do not have permanent keys.

I, Verlin T. Moyer, hereby certify the above represents the electronic voting system security policy of Mercer County to be on file with the Secretary of State by February 1, 2020. This policy shall remain in full force and effect until January 31, 2022 or until: 1) superseded by an amended policy filed with the Secretary of State within 30 days after adoption; 2) overridden, in whole or in part, by state or federal law; or 3) invalidated by the ruling of any court of competent jurisdiction.
